4th Quarter Sales Tax Data Released



Here are a few key takeaways from Morgan Hill's 4th Quarter 2021 sales tax numbers:

- Gross sales receipts for Morgan Hill were up 28.3% compared to 4th Quarter 2020
- Taxable sales for all of Santa Clara County grew 11.6% and sales for the Bay Area grew 13.2% compared to 4th Quarter 2020
- Morgan Hill Auto and Transportation sales grew nearly 50% compared to 4th Quarter 2020
- Electrical equipment sales led to growth in the Business and Industry group
- Restaurant and hotel revenue jumped 37% compared to 4th Quarter 2020
- Overall place of sale collections increased 35.1% signaling the return of brick and

Morgan Hill Outdoor Dining Program

On May 4, 2022, the Economic Development team will present the Morgan Hill Outdoor



Dining Program during the City Council meeting. The program provides guidelines, standards, and processes for outdoor dining on private and public property. Additionally, staff is proposing a Parklet Grant Funding Program to aide in the transition of existing parklets and the construction of new parklets to the new longer-term parklet program.

Development Opportunities Map

The Development Opportunities Map outlines industrial and mixed-use projects, and has been revised to now include residential projects. Housing projects are identified by a "blue house" marker and list the number of units being built per project. There are 2,900 new housing units currently in the development pipeline to be built between now and 2024.

Broadband Improvements

Several communications companies are currently working on upgrading and installing new communication cables and conduit throughout the City. This work includes cutting into the roadway and placing or repairing cables and conduit. This work includes placing fiber optic cable on existing poles or Send your questions HERE installing new underground facilities into the roadway and/or onto sidewalk areas. One of the largest companies doing work throughout the City is Frontier Communications who is using the subcontractor HCI, Inc. for the installation.

Work is occurring in multiple areas and may include road closures or lane reductions. This work should not impact your utility service.


Zero-Emission Transportation Manufacturing Grant

The California Energy Commission's Clean Transportation Program announces the availability of up to \$60 million in grant funds for projects that will increase in-state manufacturing of zero-emission vehicles (ZEV), ZEV components and batteries, and ZEV charging or refueling equipment.

Projects are eligible for awards up to 50% of total project costs or \$30 million, whichever is less. A minimum grant award of \$3 million has been set under this solicitation, resulting in a total allowable project cost requirement of at least \$6 million to apply. The deadline to submit applications is June 13, 2022.
