2022 State of the Valley Index



Updated annually, Joint Venture's Silicon Valley Index is a comprehensive report of indicators that measure the strength of our economy and the health of our community, highlighting challenges and providing an analytical foundation for leadership and decision making. EMPLOYMENT:

• Silicon Valley's unemployment rate peaked at 12% in April 2020, and returned to prepandemic numbers near the end of 2021, adding approximately 88,000 jobs in the second half of the year alone. Today, Silicon Valley's unemployment rate is 2.8%.

INCOME:

• Silicon Valley residents have an estimated collective wealth of nearly \$1.17 trillion, more than the GDP of The Netherlands. The wealthiest 25% of households account for approximately 92% of the total Valley's wealth. The income gap of residents with varying

educational levels is wider than the United States, with a \$69,000 median gap between those with a High School Diploma and those with a Bachelor's Degree. Approximately 18% of Silicon Valley households have no savings, and 33% do not earn enough to meet their most basic needs.

HOUSING:

 In 2021, the average rent for a studio apartment was more than \$2,000, the number of homes sold was up 48% from the previous year and the median home sale price was \$1.32 million. In the 2020-2021 fiscal year, only 12% of all approved residential units were affordable and approximately 79% of all housing units were located within walking distance to public transit.

INNOVATION:

• In 2021, a record 257 megadeals and \$1.2 billion in Angel Investments were made. San Jose ranked as the number one patent generating city in the nation, and approximately 22% of Silicon Valley startup companies were founded by women.

TECH:

The tech industry accounted for 1/4 of the employment growth, experiencing two
consecutive years of positive growth despite the pandemic. Of the 583,300 tech jobs as
many as 38% are employed at one of the top 25 largest tech companies, and 32% at
one of the largest 15.

COMMERCIAL:

 More than 5 million square feet of commercial space was completed in 2021, with more than 80% pre-leased upon completion. In 2021, the average rental rate for office space was \$5.54 per square foot and the average vacancy rate was 13%.

Water Supply Shortage

The City of Morgan Hill is currently in a Level 2 Water Supply Shortage. For businesses, limits now exist on automatically serving water at restaurants, hotels offering guests the option to decline daily linen service, and construction sites using non-potable water for most site activities. Depot Street Closure

Work for the Depot Church Realignment
Project began in the public right-of-way the
week of March 28, 2022, and continue
through August of 2022. During this time, the
main entrance to the Community and Cultural
Center parking lot, located at Dunne Avenue
and Church Street, will be closed. The
entrance at Depot Street will also be closed,
however access to the parking lot at the Fifth
Street entrance will remain open. There will
be a temporary loss of parking spaces during
the project timeline. Street and parking lot
impacts will be published <u>HERE</u> as the project
progresses.

The Depot Church Realignment Project will realign Depot Street with Church Street through the Community and Cultural Center (CCC) Parking lot. This project is intended to improve traffic flow into and around the Downtown area. The project is being coordinated with a private residential project to be constructed on the former Hale Lumber site. Work on the clearing of the former Hale Lumber site has commenced.

On Wednesday, April 6th at 7:00 PM, the City Council will hear and act on the Citizen's Initiative amending the General Plan to require voter approval of any future Monterey Road lane reduction. The Citizen's Initiative intends to amend the City of Morgan Hill 2035 General Plan's Transportation Element Policy TR1.5. The initiative's proponents have gathered enough signatures to place the measure on the November 2022 ballot. The City Council can take one of two actions at this meeting. They can elect to place the initiative on the November ballot, or they can elect to adopt the initiative outright. We invite you to be a part of this important discussion.

Anaerobe Systems

Mike Cox founded Anaerobe Systems in 1978. The company produces the world's only true pre-reduced anaerobically sterilized (PRAS) culture media; sterilized, poured, and packaged under strict anaerobic conditions (never exposed to oxygen). The process and machinery have been custom designed by Mike and Steve Cox, and follow a meticulous oxygen-free process resulting in the culture media having a 3-month to 3-year shelf life without requiring refrigeration. Mike also invented and patented the first gloveless anaerobic chamber over 40 years ago and is the recipient of the Anaerobe Society of Americans Lifetime Achievement Award.

Mike has been repurposing organic byproduct from growers in the Salinas, Watsonville and Gilroy areas for years now. He developed a patented method to fully recycle tomato, cabbage and water hyacinth byproduct into a solution that is reintroduced back into the soil growing the next series of plants two times as fast and as large. The fertilizer not only has the ability to be a game changer for farmers to comply with AG



Order 4.0 regulations, but could also play a significant role in organic recycling and greenhouse gas reduction worldwide.

Microbusiness Grant Portal Now Accepting Applications

In January, the County of Santa Clara Board of Supervisors accepted approximately \$2.4 million from the California Microbusiness COVID-19 Relief Grant Program to aid microbusinesses adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The program is expected to provide grant relief to at least 875 microbusinesses in two phases. This first phase will award 500 grants to qualified businesses on a first-come, first-served basis. The second phase will remain open for at least 45 days and all remaining grants will be awarded on a lottery system.

To qualify for one of the \$2,500 grants, a business must have been operating in 2019, have been negatively impacted by COVID-19, made less than \$50,000 in total revenue in 2019, and have less than five employees. Applicants' businesses must still be operating or plan to reopen in 2022.
